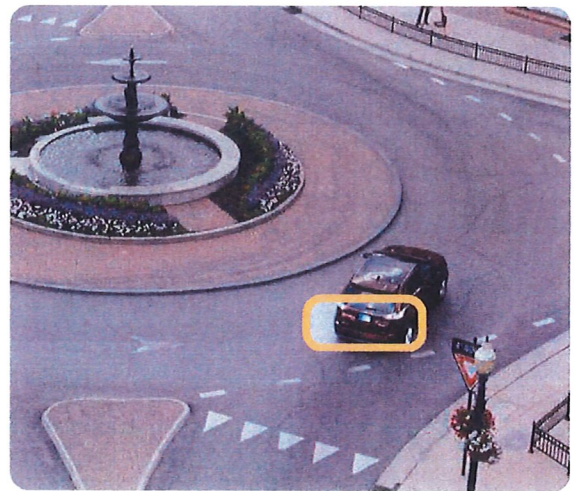


PRIVACY | TRANSPARENCY | ACCOUNTABILITY

THE ISSUE

Indiana law enforcement agencies increasingly utilize Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) technology as an important investigative tool. While many agencies have adopted internal policies governing its use, Indiana has not established a consistent statewide statutory framework addressing privacy, data retention, transparency, accountability, and oversight.

This proposal recommends the adoption of uniform statewide standards governing the responsible use of ALPR technology—protecting both public safety and the privacy of Hoosiers.



THE ASK

Support legislation establishing uniform statewide standards governing Automated License Plate Readers that protect Hoosier privacy, preserve an important public safety tool, promote transparency, and increase accountability.

THE NEED FOR STATEWIDE STANDARDS

Indiana has the opportunity to establish a consistent statewide framework governing the responsible use of ALPR technology. Uniform standards would ensure every law enforcement agency operates under the same privacy, transparency, accountability, and oversight requirements while preserving a valuable investigative tool.
